MAPPEN - Guided Inquiry Senior School


This term in Guided Inquiry we will be learning about Social Justice. Our topic entitled ‘Someone Else’s Shoes’ encourages us to discuss issues experienced by people with disabilities. We learn

about the role that rules and laws play in our community and the importance of ensuring that everyone is treated fairly and without prejudice.

This topic links directly to the development of personal and social capability including social and self-awareness which is an important component of the Victorian Curriculum.

Junior School

The junior schools Guided Inquiry unit this term will be looking at social justice through the lens of ‘Fairness and Friendships’. We will practise following classroom rules and family rules and we will consider appropriate actions in different places. We will learn techniques to manage conflict and social skills to use when working in a team. In the first week back, we have been beginning to look at the difference between what is fair and what is equal.

Term 3 marks the commencement of our transition programs and enrolment tours. During the school break, our school council president worked tirelessly to place a school brochure and letter in resident’s mailboxes within the Toolangi and Castella districts. COVID update for parents.

Rapid Antigen Testing (RATs)

These tests will continue to be available for families until the end of the year. The school has an abundance of RATs and will provide these to families each fortnight. Commencing this Monday 11/07/22 RATs will be available for parents to collect at the end of the day under the rotunda. Parents are encouraged to test their children if they are displaying symptoms and/or if they are in close contact with a household member who has tested positive for COVID.

Face Masks

Face masks are recommended for students to wear, however have not been made compulsory. Students travelling on the bus are required to wear face masks unless they have a medical exemption.

At this stage, our staffing has been relatively unaffected by COVID, however if this situation were to change, we will keep parents informed and ensure that our teaching and learning programs continue with as minimal disruption as possible.
