Senior School News

The students began the term by completing and sharing a short information text about some of the symbolic traditions of ANZAC Day, including: The Last Post, the Reveille and the minute silence; the medals; The Ode and commemorative poems; ANZAC biscuits; and Simpson and his Donkey, which helped to promote a greater understanding of the ANZAC Day service and traditions.

Our focus in maths over the coming weeks is 2and 3-dimensional shape and all things 'times tables'. Recalling multiplication facts becomes a really important skill to have as children approach secondary education and our senior students are becoming increasingly aware of this and so we will be looking at all sorts of strategies that can be used to help make remembering these number facts easier. In the inquiry unit, we are looking at history through the lens of change. The children had fun pairing up to explore the school grounds in search of a "glossary of terms" we will be using throughout the unit.

Junior School News

The junior students have become scientists this term to help them discover more about the new school inquiry theme which is Change. Last week we made ANZAC biscuits and watched what change happened to butter when we added bicarb soda. This week we made predictions about what would happen if we mixed flour, salt, oil and water all together. Believe it or not it made a lovely playdough. We then moulded our playdough around a bottle. We added bicarb soda, food dye and dish soap to the bottle. Then very slowly we added vinegar to see the change the vinegar would make.
