NAPLAN

This week marks the commencement of NAPLAN. This National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy is a series of tests focused on basic skills that are administered annually to Australian students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. The purpose of NAPLAN is to provide a snapshot of a student's current reading, writing, language, and numeracy skills. We wish our students well with NAPLAN this week and know that they will do their very best.

Semester 1 Reports

The end of this term marks the distribution of semester 1 reports. Sophie, Amanda and I will be assessing students and writing reports using the COMPASS platform.

Student Support Groups (SSG) meetings will be held in week 7 (Monday 6th, Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th June). A COMPASS post will be sent out in the next few weeks for parents to book in for their term 2 SSG meeting. Please note that this term we will be trialling a 3-way conference with our senior students to discuss progress within the Individual Education Plan (IEP) and student goals.

We encourage our senior students (yrs 3 -6) to be present for this SSG meeting.

Assessment Portfolios to Presentation Portfolios.

Prior to the current time we have prepared **assessment** portfolios for each child. The nature of this process is changing slightly for this year. Commencing this year, we will be preparing presentation portfolios rather than assessment portfolios. These presentation portfolios will contain samples of children's writing, selected art pieces, photographs, certificates etc. The

students will be selecting their pieces in consultation with Sophie, Amanda, and Sally. These folios will be collated during the year and sent home in December 2022.

Attitudes to School Survey – 2022

The Attitudes to School Survey is an annual student survey offered by the Department of Education and Training to assist schools in gaining an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. Students in Year 4, 5 and 6 will be given the opportunity to participate in this survey during the week of May 23rd to June 3rd. A parent notice with further details will be sent out to families this week.

Kitchen Garden Program

Today our grade one children handed over the broad beans they grew last year to our new preps in our annual seed sharing ceremony. First, we opened the pods to reveal the beans in their 'blankety beds'. This is a great way to practice what we have learned and observed over the seasons - germination, growth, pollination, and a completed life cycle.
