#### Curriculum News

##### Senior School

The senior school have just completed their NAPLAN assessment tasks.

We are so proud of the determination and positivity our Year 3 and 5 students demonstrated during this week of assessments. NAPLAN is a national assessment task that covers skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation and numeracy. The implementation of NAPLAN was expertly led by Amanda and we thank her for managing this process so well. This

includes the hot chocolate that our students enjoyed at the end of their assessments.

## MAPPEN

This term we are studying sustainability through a unit of work entitled Think Global and Act Local. The rationale is to learn about the natural world and how we are changing it. In turn this motivates us to live sustainably.

We will be investigating:

- Mapping and the world of geographers
- Building weather instruments and using them to collect data
- Using tables and graphs to record weather data
- Severe weather and natural disaster

## Junior School

This term in the Junior room children are learning all about sustainability and in particular recycling, reducing and reusing. The children had a close look at the school's rubbish and buried some selected pieces. At the end of the term we will dig them up and see if the predictions we made after burying them are right. Some of the items we chose to bury include, a twistie packet, an apple core, yoghurt tub and paper. Most of the children predicted that most of the rubbish we buried will have turned into soil when we dig it up after 7 weeks. We can't wait to see if our predictions are correct!
